

HB 134 -- NON-GENERATION COST INCORPORATION

SPONSOR: Berry

This bill allows electrical corporations to incorporate costs not associated with electricity generation into the corporations' rate bases to recover its costs through a general rate proceeding. Such non-generation costs include operating costs, maintenance costs, repair costs, administrative overhead, safety and security costs, regulatory costs unrelated to construction requirements, and any other costs not directly associated with the construction of electricity generating facilities. Generation costs may also be incorporated into a rate base through a general rate proceeding once a generation plant or facility becomes fully operational.
