1 AMEND House Bill No. 1880, Page 2, Section 394.085, Line 27, by inserting immediately after all  
2 of said section and line the following:

4 "620.3150. 1. The comprehensive state energy plan developed by the division of energy  
5 shall be reviewed by the division by January 1, 2020, and biennially thereafter, and updated if  
6 necessary, in accordance with the provisions of this section.

7 2. The state's comprehensive state energy plan shall be reviewed to ensure that it:

8 (1) Is consistent with Article I, Section 2 of the Missouri Constitution;

9 (2) Encourages private investment in energy solutions that will help customers better  
10 manage their energy bills and help reduce fuel costs while ensuring fairness;

11 (3) Develops free market strategies to attract private capital investment;

12 (4) Identifies and evaluates transportation alternatives;

13 (5) Creates an uncumbersome regulatory environment that allows the state's energy utilities  
14 to chart a vibrant changing future by operating with greater efficiency, consumer flexibility, and  
15 reliability, and that supports pricing that is predictable and sustainable;

16 (6) Supports public and private efforts to foster a supply of energy to consumers that is  
17 abundant, reliable, and cost efficient; and

18 (7) Monitors areas of potential growth or development, including forecasts of five and ten  
19 years for energy demand and supply, infrastructure demands, and identification of additional costs,  
20 risks, benefits, uncertainties, and market potential of energy supply resource alternatives.

21 3. The division of energy, either directly or through contracting with an organization that is  
22 qualified to adequately meet the aforementioned goals, shall use a diverse stakeholder system  
23 through both online engagement and in-person meetings throughout the state to conduct the review.

24 4. A report shall be issued by the division of energy, along with the review required under  
25 this section, that shall suggest policy changes for the state that:

26 (1) Provide improved reliability of the energy systems within the state;

27 (2) Insulate customers from volatility in market prices;

28 (3) Reduce the overall cost of energy in the state;

29 (4) Reasonably address public health and environmental impacts; and

30 (5) Identify and analyze emerging trends in supply, price, demand, and technology, as well  
31 as energy policies and programs that impact the state."; and

33 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references  
34 accordingly.
