1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill Nos. 2277 & 1983, Page 3, Section 301.142,
2 Line 79, by inserting after all of said line the following:

3
4 "If at any time an individual who obtained disabled license plates issued under this
5 subsection no longer occupies a residence with a physically disabled person, or no longer owns a
6 vehicle that is operated at least fifty percent of the time by a physically disabled person, such
7 individual shall surrender the disabled license plates to the department within thirty days of
8 becoming ineligible for their use."; and

9
10 Further amend said bill, Page 4, Section 301.142, Line 104, by inserting immediately after the
11 phrase "disabled person" on said line the following:

12 " , and shall be surrendered to the department, within thirty days, if a group, organization, or
13 entity that obtained the removable windshield placard due to the transportation of more than one
14 physically disabled person no longer transports more than one disabled person."; and

16 Further amend said bill and section, Page 5, Line 149, to Page 6, Line 179, by removing all of said
17 lines from the bill and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

19 "17. Every new applicant for a disabled license plate or placard shall be required to present
20 a new physician's statement dated no more than ninety days prior to such application. Renewal
21 applicants will be required to submit a physician's statement dated no more than ninety days prior to
22 such application upon their first renewal occurring on or after August 1, 2005. Upon completing
23 subsequent renewal applications, a physician's statement dated no more than ninety days prior to
24 such application shall be required every [fourth] eighth year. Such physician's statement shall state
25 the expiration date for the temporary windshield placard. If the physician fails to record an
26 expiration date on the physician's statement, the director shall issue the temporary windshield
27 placard for a period of thirty days. The director may stagger the requirement of a physician's
28 statement on all renewals for the initial implementation of a [four-year] eight-year period.

29 18. The director of revenue upon receiving a physician's statement pursuant to this

1 subsection shall check with the state board of registration for the healing arts created in section
2 334.120, or the Missouri state board of nursing established in section 335.021, with respect to
3 physician's statements signed by advanced practice registered nurses, or the Missouri state board of
4 chiropractic examiners established in section 331.090, with respect to physician's statements signed
5 by licensed chiropractors, or with the board of optometry established in section 336.130, with
6 respect to physician's statements signed by licensed optometrists, or the state board of podiatric
7 medicine created in section 330.100, with respect to physician's statements signed by physicians of
8 the foot or podiatrists to determine whether the physician is duly licensed and registered pursuant to
9 law. If such applicant obtaining a disabled license plate or placard presents proof of disability in the
10 form of a statement from the United States Veterans' Administration verifying that the person is
11 permanently disabled, the applicant shall be exempt from the [four-year] eight-year certification
12 requirement of this subsection for renewal of the plate or placard. Initial applications shall be
13 accompanied by the physician's statement required by this section. Notwithstanding the provisions
14 of paragraph (f) of subdivision (4) of subsection 1 of this section, any person seventy-five years of
15 age or older who provided the physician's statement with the original application shall not be
16 required to provide a physician's statement for the purpose of renewal of disabled persons license
17 plates or windshield placards."; and

19 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
20 accordingly.
