

HB 1339 -- SECURITY THREATS

SPONSOR: Newman

This bill specifies that a person commits a class D felony of making a threat to the security of a public building or a public school in the first degree, when a person 18 years of age or older communicates a knowingly false report that jeopardizes security procedures or knowingly causes a false belief or fear that causes the initiation of security procedures. Making a threat to the security of a public building or public school in the second degree, specified in the bill, is a class E felony, and making a threat to a public building or public school in the third degree, specified in the bill, is a class A misdemeanor.

This bill is similar to HB 360 (2017).
