2 **WHEREAS**, the President of the United States has immense enumerated powers and
3 serves as both the head of the executive branch of government of the United States and as
4 Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces; and

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5 **WHEREAS**, the election of the President of the United States should be free and fair in
6 order to preserve the legitimacy of the government, avoid constitutional crisis, and promote the
7 general welfare of the people of the United States; and

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9 **WHEREAS**, the legislatures of the states are delegated primary responsibility to ensure
10 that free and fair elections for the office of the Presidency of the United States are held under
11 Article II, Section 1 of the Constitution of the United States which allows each state to appoint
12 presidential Electors in such manner as the legislature thereof may direct; and

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14 **WHEREAS**, the Congress of the United States is authorized under Amendment XII of
15 the Constitution of the United States and the Electoral Count Act of 1887 to independently
16 evaluate whether or not free and fair elections have occurred and to uphold the fundamental
17 principle that the laws governing elections that are enacted by the legislatures of the states prior
18 to the election are fully complied with during the election process; and

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20 **WHEREAS**, historically low absentee ballot rejection rates occurred in the 2020 election
21 despite the overwhelming new and unprecedented use of absentee ballots and mail in votes by
22 many different persons and organizations; and

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24 **WHEREAS**, a razor thin margin favoring Biden was reported in the days after election
25 day in many swing states including Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan, Georgia, Arizona, and
26 Nevada and political analyst Robert Barnes observed that Trump would win the election if any
27 historical absentee ballot analysis process and rejection rate was assumed;

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29 **WHEREAS**, statistically abnormal vote counts were reported in numerous states late on
30 election night and the Biden-to-Trump ratio in reporting was 90 percent or more for some
31 batches of votes;

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33 **WHEREAS**, the manifest lack of any absentee ballot and mail in ballot oversight by
34 unelected election administrators shows that the laws passed prior to election day were likely
35 ignored and violated in numerous ways and that this violation was of significant magnitude to
36 change the results for the election of the President of the United States; and

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38 **WHEREAS**, in Pennsylvania 23,000 absentee ballots have impossible return dates,
39 86,000 absentee ballots are questionable, 50,000 votes held on 47 USB cards are missing in
40 Delaware County, and signature matching for mail in ballots has been rendered impossible by
41 the destruction of ballot envelopes; and

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43 **WHEREAS**, in Georgia, Matt Braynard's Voter Integrity Project estimates that 20,312
44 nonresidents cast ballots, there is video evidence of the statistical anomalies that occurred when
45 Biden overtook President Trump with 89 percent of the votes counted, and for 53 different
46 individual batches of votes counted, Biden led by the same 50.05 to 49.95 percent margin in
47 every single batch; and

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49 **WHEREAS**, a full and fair investigation of the election results, including analysis of
50 absentee and mail in ballot samples for compliance with state election law, is necessary to ensure
51 a free and fair election and should be conducted by Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan, Georgia,
52 Arizona, and Nevada:

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54 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the members of the House of
55 Representatives of the one Hundredth General Assembly, Second Extraordinary Session, hereby
56 have no faith in the validity of the results of the 2020 presidential election reported by the states
57 of Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan, Georgia, Arizona, and Nevada; and

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59 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that if a full and fair investigation is not completed,
60 that the United States Congress sitting in joint session refuse to accept electoral votes for the
61 office of President of the United States from the states of Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan,
62 Georgia, Arizona, and Nevada; and

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64 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
65 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for each
66 house of the United States Congress.

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
