FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§192.022 – Gyms treated same as health care facilities in public health and safety orders that close/restrict business operations

Officials from **Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services (PHHS)** state there will be an unknown cost due to an increase in COVID-19 or other communicable disease cases requiring disease investigation and contact tracing. It is impossible to estimate how many additional COVID-19 or other disease cases there will be because it is unknown how many people will be exposed to communicable diseases/viruses/bacteria as a result of gyms not being under appropriate health orders to prevent the spread of disease.

Oversight notes it is currently the responsibility of local public health agencies (LPHAs) to conduct disease investigation and contact tracing regardless of whether a statewide emergency has been proclaimed by the governor. It is assumed any potential costs that may be incurred as a result of this proposal are indirect costs. Therefore, Oversight will present no fiscal impact for provisions of this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **City of Kansas City**, the **City of O’Fallon**, the **City of Springfield**, the **City of St. Louis**, the **City of Tipton** and the **Newton County Health Department** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, local public health agencies and various county officials were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

This proposal could positively impact small business gyms as they would be treated as health care facilities when public health or safety orders close or partially close business operations. (§192.022)


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
