## AN ACT

To repeal section 566.150, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to location restrictions for certain offenders, with penalty provisions.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:*

Section A. Section 566.150, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 566.150, to read as follows:

566.150. 1. **Except as provided under subsection 2 of this section**, any person who has been found guilty of:

(1) Violating any of the provisions of this chapter or the provisions of section 568.020, incest; section 568.045, endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree; section 573.200, use of a child in a sexual performance; section 573.205, promoting a sexual performance by a child; section 573.023, sexual exploitation of a minor; section 573.025, promoting child pornography; or section 573.040, furnishing pornographic material to minors; or

(2) Any offense in any other jurisdiction which, if committed in this state, would be a violation listed in this section;

shall not knowingly be present in or loiter within five hundred feet of any real property comprising any public park with playground equipment, a public swimming pool, [or] any museum if such museum holds itself out to the public as and exists with the primary purpose of entertaining or educating children under eighteen years of age, **or any nature or education center controlled by the Missouri department of conservation.**

2. **Any person who has been found guilty of an offense under subdivision (1) or (2) of subsection 1 of this section who is the parent, legal guardian, or custodian of a child**

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.
