JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment to Article X of the Constitution of Missouri, by adopting one new section relating to property tax exemptions.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday in November, 2022, or at a special election to be called by the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or rejection, the following amendment to Article X of the Constitution of the state of Missouri:

Section A. Article X, Constitution of Missouri, is amended by adopting one new section, to be known as Section 6(c), to read as follows:

Section 6(c). Effective January 1, 2027, in addition to all other exemptions provided under this Article and notwithstanding any provisions of this Article to the contrary, all personal property shall be fully exempt from taxation.

Section B. Under chapter 116, RSMo, and other applicable constitutional provisions and laws of this state allowing the general assembly to adopt ballot language for the submission of a joint resolution to the voters of this state, the official ballot title of the amendment proposed in section A shall be as follows:

"Shall all taxing authorities in the State of Missouri exempt all personal property from taxation beginning on January 1, 2027?"

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EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.
