### JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri an amendment repealing Section 8 of Article III of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to term limits for members of the general assembly.

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring therein:*

That at the next general election to be held in the state of Missouri, on Tuesday next  
2 following the first Monday in November, 2022, or at a special election to be called by the  
3 governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to the qualified voters of this state, for  
4 adoption or rejection, the following amendment to Article III of the Constitution of the state of  
5 Missouri:

Section A. Section 8, Article III, Constitution of Missouri, is repealed and one new  
2 section adopted in lieu thereof, to be known as Section 8, to read as follows:

Section 8. No one shall be elected to serve more than eight years total in any one house  
2 of the General Assembly nor more than sixteen years total in both houses of the General  
3 Assembly. **Members of the General Assembly elected for the first time on or after**  
4 **November 8, 2022, shall serve no more than twelve years in any one house or total in both**  
5 **houses.** In applying this section, [~~service in the General Assembly resulting from an election~~  
6 ~~prior to December 3, 1992, or~~] service of less than one year, in the case of a member of the house  
7 of representatives, or two years, in the case of a member of the senate, by a person elected after  
8 the effective date of this section to complete the term of another person, shall not be counted.
