We believe in federalism and the separation of powers. We believe that there is a role for the General Assembly to play in governing our State. But we also believe that there is a role for City Councils, School Boards, County Executives, the Executive Branch of State government, County Councils, County Commissioners and Mayors, all elected by voters, to play in governing their jurisdictions. Furthermore we believe that there is a role for County Health Boards, Judges, Administrative Law Judges, State Department Heads, and others, all appointed or selected through our political process in governing our State. SB 851 blindly attempts to snatch authority from all of the above entities. Such a power grab, even had it been accurately crafted, would not be in the best interest of essential workers or of the communities that they serve. The Missouri AFL-CIO respectfully urges a "No" vote on House Bill 851.
