JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment repealing section 50 of article III of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to the process for amending the law.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

That at the next general election to be held in the

- 2 state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday
- 3 in November, 2022, or at a special election to be called by
- 4 the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to
- 5 the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or
- 6 rejection, the following amendment to article III of the
- 7 Constitution of the state of Missouri:
 - Section A. Section 50, article III, Constitution of
- 2 Missouri, is repealed and one new section adopted in lieu
- 3 thereof, to be known as section 50, to read as follows:
 - Section 50. 1. Initiative petitions proposing
- 2 amendments to the constitution shall be signed by [eight]
- 3 ten percent of the legal voters, registered to vote in
- 4 Missouri and citizens of the United States, in each of [two-
- 5 thirds of] the congressional districts in the state, and
- 6 petitions proposing laws shall be signed by five percent of
- 7 such voters. Every such petition shall be filed with the
- 8 secretary of state not less than six months before the
- 9 election and shall contain an enacting clause and the full

- text of the measure. Voters in each congressional district 10 11 shall have the opportunity to review and comment upon all 12 initiative petitions proposing amendments to the constitution following the filing of the petition with the 13 secretary of state and not less than fifteen days before the 14 15 measure appears on the ballot. Such review and comment process shall be administered by the secretary of state in a 16 17 public forum. Petitions for constitutional amendments shall not contain more than one amended and revised article of 18 19 this constitution, or one new article which shall not 20 contain more than one subject and matters properly connected therewith, and the enacting clause thereof shall be "Be it 21 22 resolved by the people of the state of Missouri that the Constitution be amended:". Petitions for laws shall contain 23 not more than one subject which shall be expressed clearly 24 in the title, and the enacting clause thereof shall be "Be 25 26 it enacted by the people of the state of Missouri:". For purposes of this article, only citizens of the United States 27 of America who are residents of the State of Missouri and 28
- Notwithstanding Section 2(b) of Article XII of this 31 Constitution, or any other provisions of this Constitution 32 33 or laws to the contrary, if two-thirds of the votes cast 34 thereon are in favor of any constitutional amendment, whether proposed by the general assembly or by initiative, 35 the same shall take effect at the end of thirty days after 36 the election. This subsection shall only apply to 37 constitutional amendments submitted to the people after 38 39 January 1, 2023.
