AN ACT

To repeal sections 488.040, 494.455, and 494.460, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to the compensation of jurors.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 488.040, 494.455, and 494.460, RSMo, are repealed and three
2 new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 488.040, 494.455, and 494.460,
3 to read as follows:

488.040. 1. Each grand and petit juror shall, pursuant to the provisions of section
2 494.455, receive ~~[six]~~ **twenty-five** dollars per day for every day he or she may actually serve
3 as such and seven cents for every mile he or she may necessarily travel going from his or her
4 place of residence to the courthouse and returning, to be paid from funds of the county or a
5 city not within a county.

6 2. Provided that a county or a city not within a county authorizes daily compensation
7 payable from county or city funds for jurors who serve in that county pursuant to subsection 3
8 of this section in the amount of at least six dollars per day in addition to the amount required
9 by subsection 1 of this section, a person shall receive an additional six dollars per day,
10 pursuant to the provisions of section 494.455, to be reimbursed by the state of Missouri so
11 that the total compensation payable shall be at least ~~[eighteen]~~ **thirty-seven** dollars, plus
12 mileage as indicated in subsection 1 of this section, for each day that the person actually
13 serves as a petit juror in a particular case; or for each day that a person actually serves as a
14 grand juror during a term of a grand jury. The state shall reimburse the county for six dollars
15 of the additional juror compensation provided by this subsection.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets ~~[thus]~~ in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

16 3. The governing body of each county or a city not within a county may authorize
17 additional daily compensation and mileage allowance for jurors, which additional
18 compensation shall be paid from the funds of the county or a city not within a county.
19 The governing body of each county or a city not within a county may authorize additional
20 daily compensation and mileage allowance for jurors attending a coroner's inquest. Jurors
21 may receive the additional compensation and mileage allowance authorized by this subsection
22 only if the governing body of the county or the city not within a county authorizes the
23 additional compensation. The provisions of this subsection authorizing additional
24 compensation shall terminate upon the issuance of a mandate by the Missouri supreme
25 court which results in the state of Missouri being obligated or required to pay any such
26 additional compensation even if such additional compensation is formally approved or
27 authorized by the governing body of a county or a city not within a county.

28 4. When each panel of jurors summoned and attending court has completed its
29 service, the board of jury commissioners shall cause to be submitted to the governing body of
30 the county or a city not within a county a statement of fees earned by each juror. Within thirty
31 days of the submission of the statement of fees, the governing body shall cause payment to be
32 made to those jurors summoned the fees earned during their service as jurors.

 494.455. 1. Each county or city not within a county may elect to compensate its
2 jurors pursuant to subsection 2 of this section except as otherwise provided in subsection 3 of
3 this section.

4 2. Each grand and petit juror shall receive ~~[six]~~ **twenty-five** dollars per day, for every
5 day he or she may actually serve as such, and seven cents for every mile he or she may
6 necessarily travel going from his or her place of residence to the courthouse and returning, to
7 be paid from funds of the county or a city not within a county. The governing body of each
8 county or a city not within a county may authorize additional daily compensation and mileage
9 allowance for jurors, which additional compensation shall be paid from the funds of the
10 county or a city not within a county. The governing body of each county or a city not within a
11 county may authorize additional daily compensation and mileage allowance for jurors
12 attending a coroner's inquest. Jurors may receive the additional compensation and mileage
13 allowance authorized by this subsection only if the governing body of the county or the city
14 not within a county authorizes the additional compensation. The provisions of this subsection
15 authorizing additional compensation shall terminate upon the issuance of a mandate by the
16 Missouri supreme court which results in the state of Missouri being obligated or required to
17 pay any such additional compensation even if such additional compensation is formally
18 approved or authorized by the governing body of a county or a city not within a county.
19 Provided that a county or a city not within a county authorizes daily compensation payable
20 from county or city funds for jurors who serve in that county pursuant to this subsection in the

21 amount of at least six dollars per day in addition to the amount required by this subsection, a
22 person shall receive an additional six dollars per day to be reimbursed by the state of Missouri
23 so that the total compensation payable shall be at least ~~[eighteen]~~ **thirty-seven** dollars, plus
24 mileage for each day that the person actually serves as a petit juror in a particular case; or for
25 each day that a person actually serves as a grand juror during a term of a grand jury. The state
26 shall reimburse the county for six dollars of the additional juror compensation provided by
27 this subsection.

28 3. In any county of the first classification without a charter form of government and
29 with a population of at least two hundred thousand inhabitants, no grand or petit juror shall
30 receive compensation for the first two days of service, but shall receive fifty dollars per day
31 for the third day and each subsequent day he or she may actually serve as such, and seven
32 cents for every mile he or she may necessarily travel going from his or her place of residence
33 to the courthouse and returning, to be paid from funds of the county.

34 4. **If a person is employed, in addition to the compensation owed to such person**
35 **under subsection 2 or 3 of this section, an employer shall compensate such person his or**
36 **her daily average minimum pay for each day such person actually serves on a jury.**

37 5. When each panel of jurors summoned and attending court has completed its
38 service, the board of jury commissioners shall cause to be submitted to the governing body of
39 the county or a city not within a county a statement of fees earned by each juror. Within thirty
40 days of the submission of the statement of fees, the governing body shall cause payment to be
41 made to those jurors summoned the fees earned during their service as jurors.

494.460. 1. An employer shall not terminate, discipline, threaten or take adverse
2 actions against an employee on account of that employee's receipt of or response to a jury
3 summons.

4 2. An employee discharged in violation of this section may bring civil action against
5 his or her employer within ninety days of discharge for recovery of lost wages and other
6 damages caused by the violation and for an order directing reinstatement of the employee. If
7 the employee prevails, the employee shall be entitled to receive a reasonable attorney's fee.

8 3. An employee ~~[may]~~ **shall** not be required or requested to use annual, vacation,
9 personal, or sick leave for time spent responding to a summons for jury duty~~[-]~~ **or** time spent
10 participating in the jury selection process~~[-, or time spent actually serving on a jury]~~. **Except**
11 **if an employee actually serves on a jury**, nothing in this provision shall be construed to
12 require an employer to provide annual, vacation, personal, or sick leave to employees under
13 the provisions of this statute who otherwise are not entitled to such benefits under company
14 policies. **Any employee required to actually serve on a jury shall be compensated by an**
15 **employer as provided under subsection 4 of section 494.455.**

16 4. A court shall automatically postpone and reschedule the service of a summoned
17 juror of an employer with five or fewer full-time employees, or their equivalent, if another
18 employee of that employer has been previously summoned to appear during the same period.
19 Such postponement will not effect an individual's right to one automatic postponement
20 pursuant to section 494.432.

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
