HB 2782 -- BLIND PENSIONS

SPONSOR: Young

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Emerging Issues by a vote of 10 to 0. Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Rules- Administrative Oversight by a vote of 9 to 0.

This bill removes a requirement that any notice sent to an applicant or recipient of Blind Pension funds must be sent by certified mail. Instead, the bill allows the notice to be sent by any mail delivered by the United States Postal Service.

This bill is the same as HB 1564 (2022) and HB 117 (2021).

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that the requirement for receipt of pension funds to be sent through certified mail can be onerous on blind individuals who may not have assistance or otherwise have the means of receiving certified mail. By removing the requirement that such mail be through certified mail, blind individuals will be able to receive pension payments they are entitled to much easier. Further, by removing the requirement that these pension payments be distributed through certified mail, the Department of Social Services anticipates saving over \$100,000 a year, beginning in Fiscal Year 2024.

Testifying for the bill was Representative Young.
