Good morning, Representative Evans and members of the House Judiciary Committee. My name is Laura Turner. I am the Senior Manager, Advocacy - Missouri and Arkansas, for the American Lung Association. The American Lung Association is offering testimony in opposition to HB 1624. The American Lung Association is the nation's oldest voluntary public health organization with a mission? to save lives by improving?lung?health and preventing?lung?disease. We do this through education, advocacy, and research on behalf of the 36 million Americans living with lung diseases including lung cancer and COPD. When we found ourselves in the midst of a respiratory pandemic in 2020, the American Lung Association knew we had an important role. We launched a \$25 million campaign to end COVID-19 and defend against future respiratory virus pandemics, funding research awards and grants for preventative research as well as working to evaluate the effects of COVID-19 on patients with chronic lung disease. We have worked in coalition with government, private industry, and public health organizations to address this pandemic on every level. Throughout our nation's history. vaccinations have been an important tool to save countless lives and eradicate deadly disease from smallpox to the flu and now they are an important tool to help us address the pandemic we face today. In a pandemic, time is measured in lives lost and people left with severe, debilitating health effects. The sooner every Missourian and American gets fully vaccinated, the better chance we stand of ending the pandemic and moving our state and nation forward. If passed, this bill will derail our efforts and threaten the health of the 1,082,000 Missourians living with lung disease. Our public policies should focus on ensuring everyone is vaccinated. Over 206 million people in the United States are fully vaccinated, and billions of people worldwide have received a COVID-19 vaccine (1). The vaccines have undergone the most intensive safety monitoring in U.S. history and claims that they are not extensively tested are false. The evidence is clear that they reduce the risk of hospitalizations and deaths from COVID-19, as well as the risk of contracting and spreading the virus (2). As the trusted champion for lung health, the American Lung Association is focused on slowing the spread and defeating COVID-19. To further protect the overall population and those most vulnerable, we need a sufficiently high proportion of the population to get vaccinated to stop coronavirus transmission. We hope you will work to protect the health and safety of all Missourians by encouraging everyone to get vaccinated and boosted and reject policies that slow the uptake of vaccinations and spread false information about their safety. For those reasons we strongly urge you to oppose HB 1624.1.

LeadingAge Missouri (LA MO) is an association of 130 mostly non-profit senior living and healthcare providers across Missouri. LA MO members deliver the full continuum of aging services, including nursing home care, assisted living, hospice, home & community-based services, adult day care and affordable and market rate senior housing. Usually, a LA MO member delivers multiple levels of senior care and aging services in a single building or on a single campus. Many settings for senior care and aging services in Missouri are certified by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). This includes the vast majority of Misssouri nursing homes, immediate care facilities, hospices, and home & community-based service providers. CMS certification allows senior care providers to be reimbursed by CMS for Medicare or Medicaid patient care and services. To highlight the significance of this, in Missouri the average nursing home receives more than 65% of its revenue from CMS reimbursement. Accordingly, there is little doubt that large numbers of Missouri nursing homes, intermediate care facilities, hospices and home care providers will fail without CMS payments leaving thousands of vulnerable, older Missouri citizens without care services and thousands of Missouri aging services providers without work. In the case of nursing homes, they are frequently one of the largest employers in smaller Missouri communities. Without question, large scale nursing home closure in Missouri would be devastating for Missouri citizens (both residents and families) and the State's economy, and with thousands of displaced older Missourians there would be a social crisis of substantial proportions. Missouri aging services organization must comply with CMS requirements to remain financially viable and serve Missouri citizens. Recently, CMS issued an Interim Final Rule (IFR) mandating all staff in CMS-certified facilities to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Missouri and other states challenged CMS' authority and rationale for the IFR and, initially, lower federal courts enjoined enforcement of the CMS rule. However, the U.S. Supreme Court recently overruled lower courts in favor of CMS and ended the IFR's stay of enforcement while the cases proceed in the lower courts. Consequently, staff (broadly defined in the IFR) in all Missouri CMS-certified facilities will soon be required to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19. There two exemptions to the IFR for facility staff medical contraindication and sincerely held religious belief, practice, or observance. These two exemptions require application and approval consistent with CMS guidance. The CMS IFR preempts contradictory state or local law. Accordingly, Missouri may not overrule the vaccination mandate applied to CMS-certified facility workers. States may legislate for more restrictive application of a federal law but may not diminish or dilute federal requirements. LeadingAge Missouri believes Missouri may not authorize additional exemptions to the CMS mandate beyond the two specifically authorized. Additionally state authorized exemptions would dilute application of the CMS vaccination mandate. The CMS IFR broadly applies to all "staff", which includes employees, licensed practitioners, students, trainees, volunteers, contracted staff, and any individual providing care, treatment, or

services under contract or other arrangement. The IFR recognizes the vaccination requirement does not apply to workers who perform 100% remote work or telework and who have absolutely no contact with patients/residents/participants or other staff, However, employees and individuals who have any contact with other staff must be vaccinated, regardless of whether they have contact with patients/residents/participants. This means that, except in rare cases, all employees of senior living and healthcare communities - whether working in the CMS-certified care settings or not - will have to be vaccinated or meet one of the two exemptions from vaccination. Large numbers of Missouri senior living and healthcare facilities offer multiple levels of senior care where CMS-certified nursing staff routinely engage with staff in other non-CMS-certified settings. For example, hundreds of Missouri facilities (especially in smaller communities) provide both nursing care and assisted living care in the same structure - often in different hallways on the same facility floor. Routinely, nursing home and assisted living staff serve both nursing home and assisted living residents. Both assisted living and nursing care are Missouri-licensed long-term care providers, however, only nursing homes are CMScertified. For this reason, LA MO believes providers of aging services that are not CMS-certified (like ALFs and independent living units on the same campus as CMS-certified operations) must be exempted from any state law that would impede or restrict aging services providers from delivering the safest, best care and services to Missourians entrusted to them. Aging services providers serve, protect, and care for Missouri's most vulnerable population - those 65 and older - who often have underlying healthcare conditions and who are overwhelmingly the most susceptible to negative health consequences or death from COVID-19. To protect Missourians entrusted to their care, and to provide the safest, best senior care and services possible, Missouri aging services providers must be afforded professional discretionary flexibility to "do no harm" to patients and residents by ensuring that aging services personnel caring for members of the most vulnerable population do not transmit COVID-19 to those for whom they are providing comfort, care, and services. Aging services providers should be left to exercise professional judgement - based on verifiable science, accepted healthcare practices and protocols, and competitive market forces that dictate healthcare delivery - on how to deliver the safest and best care, comfort and services to Missouri's highly vulnerable patients and residents in different settings. Having said this, it is highly likely that aging services providers operating CMS-certified facilities (with overlapping employees) will uniformly apply the workforce COVID-19 vaccination mandate to all staff - not just those impacted by the broadly inclusive IFR. These providers should be left to do so in the best interests of their residents and patients. The State should tell a provider that it should or should not require staff vaccination for COVID-19. However, LA MO offers no expertise or opinion to Missouri policymakers about appropriate workforce policies and practices for Missouri government employers or for private business employers outside aging services as regards COVID-19 vaccination requirements.
