### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

§441.740; 552.050 and 630.045 - 633.125 - Provisions relating to mental health care

Officials from the Department of Mental Health, the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Public Safety, Missouri Highway Patrol, the Department of Social Services, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Kansas City Police Department, the Phelps County Sheriff's Department and the St. Louis County Police Department each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Branson Police Department** state many law enforcement agencies and officers are extremely frustrated with the state's mental health care laws. Officials from the Branson Police Department have been meeting with hospital administrators, doctors and other law enforcement leaders in Southwest Missouri. Most people suffering from a mental health crisis that the Branson Police Department deals with are clear threats to themselves or others. However, because they do not have insurance, the hospitals routinely discharge them before local law enforcement officers have even completed the 96 hour affidavits. Because of this lack of treatment, Branson Police Department officers must deal with the same people in mental health crisis multiple times in the same shift. The Branson Police Department has a Burrell Mental Health Liaison that rides with their officers twice a week to help with their mental health outreach and the liaison agrees with the above assessment.

Although officials from the **Branson Police Department** indicate this proposal would have an impact on their organization, Oversight notes the Branson Police Department provided no information explaining the potential fiscal impact this proposal would have on their organization. Therefore, for fiscal note purposes, **Oversight** assumes any fiscal impact incurred by this police department would be absorbable within current funding levels.

**Oversight** only reflects the responses received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other circuit clerks, county prosecutors, sheriffs, police departments and hospitals were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A listing of political subdivisions included in the Missouri Legislative Information System (MOLIS) database is available upon request.

## **Rule Promulgation**

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with its core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.
