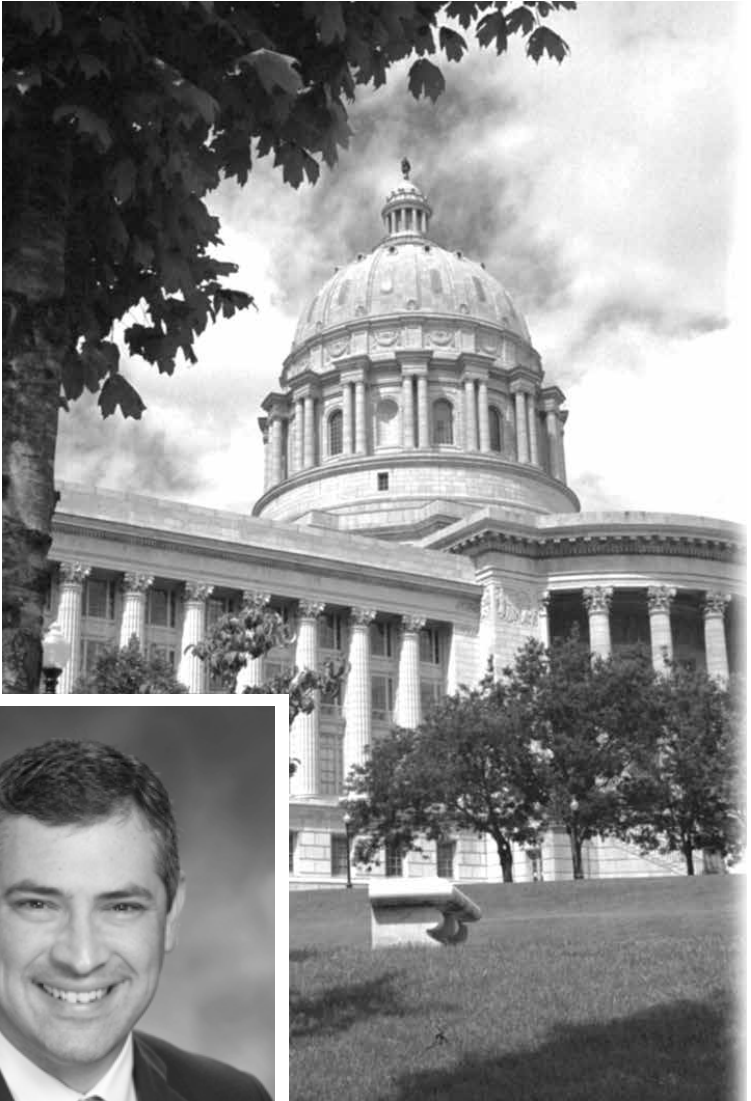

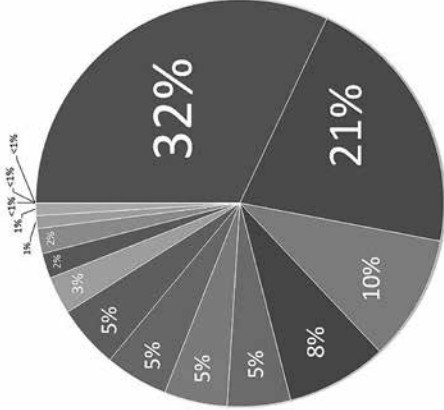

**Area Agencies on Aging (AAA)** Missouri has 10 area agencies ready to assist you. To find out if you qualify for a Medicare savings program, call AAA at (800) 677-1116.

## TAX RELIEF FOR MISSOURI SENIORS AND DISABLED

**The Missouri Property Tax Credit** allows a credit to certain senior citizens and 100% disabled individuals based on total household income (taxable and nontaxable) and the amount of property taxes or rent paid. The credit is for a maximum of \$750 for renters and \$1,100 for those who own and occupy a home.

**To be eligible a person must be:**

- 65 years of age or older,
- 60 years of age or older and receiving Social Security surviving spouse benefits, or
- 100% disabled

**The maximum income level to qualify:**

**OWNED AND OCCUPIED HOME  
FOR ENTIRE YEAR**  
**Single** - \$30,000  
**Married filing jointly** - \$34,000  
**RENTERS/PART YEAR OWNERS**  
**Single** - \$27,500  
**Married filing jointly** - \$29,500
